A New Life for Laura

Meet Laura.



A sweet, yet somewhat shy third grader at

Nueva Vida. I remember meeting her the first time I ever visited Nueva Vida. Judy told me she had had surgery for cleft palate, but it was unfinished. Laura has been on my heart for a long time. When I first moved here last year, I evaluated Laura and realized how affected her speech actually was. It broke my heart that there was nothing I could do in therapy. She has a hole in her palate the size of a dime, and if that hole is not closed off, there is

nothing I can do to help her produce her sounds better. She has been on a waiting list for cleft palate surgery for a while. About a month ago, I received a call saying there was a medical team in Antigua looking for patients with cleft palate. I got so excited as I thought of Laura and what this could mean for her life. I spoke to Judy and her mom and found out that Laura had recently had another surgery to remove her tonsils, and she had not handled the anesthesia well. Therefore, another surgery was not recommended at this time. I was crushed. I thought, "Lord, what are you doing? Isn't this the chance we've been waiting for?" But, God said, "trust me. I am in control."

I began researching other options and found out from a dentist friend of mine about an apparatus that would cover the hole. I then got in touch with Health Talents International, a mission organization here in Guatemala. They are going to be able to make it at little or no cost to us. We are planning a trip to the clinic next week to have the impression made. Laura and her mother are very grateful for this opportunity. Please pray that this apparatus will be a step in the right direction of improving Laura's speech and also her overall confidence. May God be glorified as Laura gets a new chance to communicate and hopefully one day to share what He has done in her life.

As I began my journey here at Nueva Vida, I was aware of the fact that many of the children came from extreme poverty and abusive home situations. In the past few months, many situations of children I love and know personally have been tugging at my heart. God has been teaching me to leave it up to him and place these children in His care.
