Since last writing you we have been blessed to witness four new births at the Caballito congregation in Buenos Aires, Argentina.

New Christians' stories.

Silvia Sánchez was originally contacted several years ago when she attended a class on the book of Revelation. We lost direct contact with her but stayed in touch through our online course's mailouts. Silvia returned in August of 2012 to attend a class at the Bible institute and was baptized several weeks ago. An experienced psychologist, Silvia is donating time to work with older adults who want to improve their memories. Some visitors from the neighborhood have come.

Adrián Ponce was contacted through our website and was also recently baptized. He lives two hours away but plans to continue meeting with us on Sundays, although distance prevents him from attending during the week. Adrián tells me he is reading "Your first forty days" at home with is wife, Veronica. This material is published by the International Spanish Literature Ministry and is designed to help new Christians during the first weeks of their new life.

Betty Pedernera was contacted a couple of years ago through the Let's Start Talking outreach. She and a friend, Victoria Llovet, were baptized after Laura Valdez diligently studied with them.

You may have noticed that in these four stories, a variety of ways of outreach contributed to initial contact, but personal study about the plan of salvation was the final step. May the Lord continue to show us different ways to contact people and teach them about His Kingdom.
