This is something new that is going to be included in these email updates—an update from my wife as well:

January and February have been very busy but exciting months for me. I am so glad to be back in our own house and enjoying being a stay at home Mum. Recently Noah and I started learning from Cristy Neves, a third year Bible College student. Cristy is working with Noah and I on how to teach babies holistically about God and us as his children. I am also excited about the fact that I have more time to support Nick in his ministry and to be doing my own ministries.

in powerful ways in His Kingdom. I'll keep you updated throughout this process.


