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I am currently writing this newsletter from the United States. I am home for three weeks, visiting my family and taking care of different medical visits and procedures. During this trip, I am also trying to find hearing amplification devices for some of my students with hearing loss.

This month, I wanted to highlight the progress of one of my students and how his family has also been impacted.

In the past, I have written you about Lester. He is a three year old little boy with a heart condition and a neurological condition similar to hydrocephaly. During the summer months in Guatemala, Lester tired out very quickly and had very little energy due to his heart condition. Progress seemed very slow at first, but his mom was very reliable in bringing him every session and working with him at home. In the past month, Lester began to speak more and was more energetic during the sessions. He is now imitating so much more and saying a lot of new words. His mother is very pleased and is very thankful to God for what he has done. We are also currently speaking to another

volunteer at our school about the possibility of a wheelchair for Lester. His mother is very excited about this possibility as her back tires very easily from carrying him. She is also a member of our moms' support group. I think this has been a huge blessing on her to be around other moms with children with special needs. I ask for your continued prayers for Lester as he awaits an operation for his heart. His mother is very concerned about him, and she asks for your prayers to keep his heart functioning as he awaits the operation.

I will be heading back to Guatemala on July 10. I pray that this letter finds all of you well and ask for your continued prayers for all of my children at New Life.
